What is Talking Bradford?


- Helping your child with talking is one of the ways to give them the best start for life.



- Talking to your child makes them feel happy, it will also help them make friends and learn.
- Communication skills help give your child the best start for life.

- Come to a free Play and Learn group to help your child learn language through play.






Need more support?

It's good to remember that most children with difficulties, with the right support, can catch up.




Your child may be referred for extra support


